• South Central Waterfront Framework Plan (2016)

The South Central Waterfront Framework plan is a master plan for the redevelopment of 120 acres of waterfront in Downtown Austin. The final plan includes detailed designs and cost estimates for over \$90 million of public infrastructure, a detailed economic analysis and projection of \$2.6 billion of private sector investment over 20 years, urban design guidelines for over 10 million square feet of new residential and commercial development, and strategies for implementation. Responsibilities:

- Lead a team of consultants to develop an urban design, financial, and policy framework for the redevelopment of 120 acres of waterfront in Downtown Austin
- Worked closely with the City of Austin's Principle Planner to understand the political implications of the plan and to develop a strategy to gain support from City Council, Planning Commission, and major property owners and other major local stakeholders
- Coordinated with staff in numerous City departments, including planning and zoning, sustainability, transportation, economic development, and capital improvements, to inform the development of the plan and create a broad base of support
- The final plan was adopted by Austin City Council in June 2016 and incorporated into the City's Comprehensive plan

• Livable Centers Study: Kashmere Gardens (2016)

This Livable Centers Study seeks to holistically assess and develop strategies to increase the quality of life for residents in Kashmere Gardens, a neighborhood of approximately 20,000 residents. Over on third of the residents are below the poverty line, and the study focuses on providing basic needs and infrastructure with a focus on affordable housing, community health, transportation, and environmental justice issues. Responsibilities:

- Managed a team of consultants over the course of each study, including analysis, public engagement and development of strategies.
- Coordinated community engagement and outreach with key city departments and local stakeholders.
- Special focus on housing, economic development, and community health.
- Housing New Orleans: Implementation Strategy (2016)

HousingNOLA is a community-led plan to address the housing needs of New Orleans over the next ten years. The initial study was led by the Greater New Orleans Housing Alliance - a group of housing developers, fair housing advocates and community groups — along with the City of New Orleans Housing Department.

- Led an analysis of New Orleans' transportation network in relation to public housing
- Provided project support and expertise on Transit-Oriented Development in relation to public housing in New Orleans

• METRO Houston: System Reimagining (2015)

The System Reimagining project is a comprehensive overhaul of the public transportation system in Houston, the fourth largest city in the US. The project culminated in redesign of the network and a five year service plan that better aligns local bus service with regional travel patterns, increases ridership, and better integrates the bus network with three new rail lines. The project doubled the population with access to frequent bus service and connected over over 1 million residents to jobs and employment centers without increasing the system's operating budget. Responsibilities:

- Provided project support on the analysis and design of Houston's new bus network
- Led the research and development of a guide on Transit Oriented Development for Houston-area developers
- Led the design of system-wide maps for the new bus network
